INFORMED CHOICE

In Canada today it is often easier for a woman to obtain an abortion than to obtain pregnancy support or crisis pregnancy counselling. As a result, many a woman finds the only "choice" available to solve her problems is a dead baby.

Many in today's abortion-rights establishment are determined to avoid straight talk about what abortion really is. The "no choice but pro-choice" ideology endangers women by not respecting their right to fully informed choice. Women's health is being harmed by abortion, without their knowledge or consent.

An informed abortion choice must start with the clear understanding, easily available through ultrasound, that a child is really there, beating heart and all. Next, why are women not being told about studies reporting a strong correlation between abortion, especially of a first pregnancy, and breast cancer risk? They should also be warned of the risk of post-abortion emotional trauma and harmful premature delivery of future children.

Withholding basic information shows disrespect for women and is both dishonest and patronizing, since it implies that women are "intimidated" by the truth. Ignoring or suppressing what we now know about the dangers of abortion serves a coercive agenda, which fails to care about women's most important needs.

A government which demands warnings on every pack of cigarettes should require every Canadian health care provider who counsels about, arranges, or performs abortions to tell women about the risks involved. Fundamental respect for the concept of informed consent should place these dangers above the politics of abortion so that lives can be saved.

Canadians remain deeply divided on the morality of abortion and rights of the fetus. But we believe there is general consensus that over 105,000 abortions annually in Canada is evidence of a social failure and that it is unacceptable that thousands of women take risks about which they are denied the information to truly consent.

ABORTION / BREAST CANCER LINK ASSAILED

A March 10, 2003 article entitled, "Abortion Not Linked to Cancer: scientists," has the statement that studies from 1995 onward have found no link between abortion and breast cancer. This statement flies in the face of a 1995 meta-analysis of twenty-eight worldwide studies, published in the British Medical Association's *Journal of Epidemiology and Community Health*, that showed a 30 percent increase in breast cancer attributable to a woman having one or more abortion. Twenty-four of the studies showed an increased risk.

The article quotes the National Cancer Institute's Dr. Robert Hoover as claiming that a 1996 Danish study of the risk had put the breast cancer/abortion link concern to rest.



Dr. Brind, a Professor of Biology and Endocrinology at Baruch College of the City University of New York, says - not so. In a May, 1997 article, "Abortion, Breast Cancer and Ideology," published in *First Things*, a highly respected journal of commentary on religion and public life, Dr. Brind gives a searching overview of the research flaws in the Danish study by Dr. Mads Melbye and his colleagues in Copenhagen. One problem was that although abortion had been legal in Denmark since 1939, the researchers used just the computerized abortion records

from 1973 onwards. A check of the pre -1973 abortions showed that they had misclassified some 60,000 women who had had abortions as not having any. This brought about an inaccurate database.

Dr. Brind further undermines Dr. Hoover's statement when he reports on a 1996 study published in the *Journal of the National Cancer Institute* which described a 90% increase in breast cancer in Dutch women who had had abortions.

We have to be as leery of those who denounce the abortion/breast cancer link as we do of those who at one time got away with denouncing the smoking/lung cancer risk. Perhaps we need to review how quick the National Cancer Institute was to accept the link in that one. Ideology of any stripe can lead to misrepresentation of the facts.

IMMIGRANT CARE-GIVER FIRED FOR REFUSING ABORTION

MONTREAL, March 18, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - A Filipino immigrant woman who works as a live-in caregiver was taken to hospital by her employers for an abortion without even being consulted. When she refused to have the abortion, she was fired and threatened with deportation.

Marisa (not her real name), who is 33, came to Canada two years ago under a federal live-in caregiver program. Marisa states her employer, a busy family man who found her pregnancy inconvenient, "told me I was just an immigrant and what future would this child have?" Together with her employment agency, Eurasian Homecare Services, the employer sent Marisa to Notre Dame Hospital, assuring her it "would be good for her."

Marisa says: "I thought it was for a check-up, and they were discussing everything with the doctor in French, so I didn't know what was going on."

A few minutes later she knew. "I was shocked," Marisa said. "I told them I couldn't have an abortion because it was against my religion." She has lodged complaints with Quebec's Labour Board and the Quebec Human Rights Commission.

Pro-life leaders in North America and elsewhere have often encountered similar situations where pregnant live-in workers have been callously threatened and pressured to abort their child.

BAN ON PARTIAL BIRTH ABORTION

WASHINGTON, March 13, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - By a vote of 64-33, the U.S. Senate today passed a bill to ban the practice of partial-birth abortion nationwide. The ban, twice vetoed by President Bill Clinton, is strongly supported by President George W. Bush. It now goes to the House of Representatives, which last year approved the ban by a nearly two-to-one margin.

DAY OF INFAMY

Every year the ProLife groups hold a **DAY OF INFAMY** on May 14, the day in 1969 when Canada amended the Criminal Code of Canada to decriminalize

abortions under expanded circumstances. They were to be henceforth allowed if done by a doctor, in a hospital, after medical approval for the procedure. The approval had to be given by a therapeutic abortion committee made up of doctors that made a majority decision that a woman's life or health would be threatened by a continuation of the pregnancy. This had always been considered to be a rare circumstance and the number of abortions was, accordingly, not expected to increase to any significant extent. In Prince George only three abortions were performed that first year.

However, what pro-life people had predicted soon came to pass. The strict conditions that had been adhered to prior to the adding of the word "health" soon gave way to a looser and looser interpretation. While socio-economic and eugenic reasons had been argued by the then justice minister, John Turner, to have no place in the new law, they soon became the main reasons for abortion. That pattern continues today. In British Columbia, by 1995, the number of abortions had climbed from 2,906 in 1970, the year after legalizing "health" reasons, to 10,076. Canada-wide they went from 11,200 in 1970, to 49,390 in 1975. The pro-life movement in Canada presented over 1 million signatures on petitions to the federal government asking that the right-to-life of the unborn child be protected. It was to no avail. By 2003, over 2 million unborn babies have been killed by abortion in Canada.

On March 28 of this year, Statistics Canada reported that 105,427 babies were aborted in Canada in the Year 2000. At this time, abortion takes the life of almost one out of every three babies conceived in this country. At the present time, the 1969 law having been struck down by the Supreme Court of Canada on procedural grounds, there is no law against the killing of the unborn child. This situation is unconscionable.

The National March For Life will be held in Ottawa on May 14, beginning at 1:00 pm. Last year over 1000 people attended the annual protest on Parliament Hill. Representatives of pro-life groups from across the country are especially welcomed at this event. Our group has never participated in this way due to the high cost of travel. However, we always have a local protest on this day.

Please come out on Wednesday, May 14, from 2:00 to 3:00 pm, just west of Prince George Regional Hospital on 15th Avenue. The Canada-wide message this year is: "LIFE IS THE ONLY CHOICE." There will also be signs saying "Abortion Kills Children", "Abortion Hurts Women", and "We Need a Law".

Public protests are a legitimate and honourable way of seeking legislative changes in a democracy. Please consider such participation part of your civic duty in the case of abortion.

WRONGFUL BIRTH

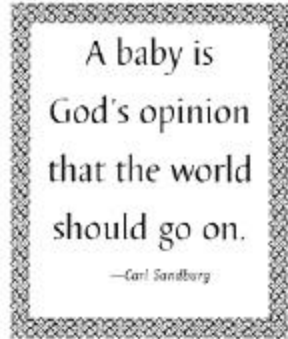
In January of this year a Richmond doctor was ordered by the Supreme Court of BC to pay a couple \$325,000 for the wrongful birth of their Downs syndrome daughter.

The woman had been advised while in Hong Kong that, being in her late thirties, there was a chance she might be carrying a child with genetic defects. There's about a one in a 1,000 chance of such happening. Upon her return to Canada, her Richmond doctor told her that by time he got the appointment booked it would be too late in the pregnancy. The fact that he didn't take a more aggressive approach worked against him in the court.

Amniocentesis is often used to try to discover the physical condition of the unborn child. According to Dr. Will Johnston, president of Physicians for Life, amniocentesis is a relatively dangerous procedure, often performed in situations where it has more of a chance of causing the death of the baby than of discovering a chromosomal defect. He stated in a January 30 press release from his group, that a recent study in Britain showed that amniocentesis had likely caused the death of about 400 healthy babies. Dr. Johnston declared it deplorable that anyone's birth be declared as "a wrong thing warranting legal action."

Elizabeth Dolman of the Canadian Downs Syndrome Society condemned the ruling. "Making that decision devalues people with Downs syndrome and suggests their lives aren't worth living."

This is the second wrongful birth case in Canada. Last year the Supreme Court of Canada opened the flood-gates by declaring a Manitoba doctor liable for 1.5 million dollars in costs for not warning a pregnant woman that continuing on her medication for epilepsy could cause risks to her unborn child. The doctor had decided to "not unduly worry an expectant mother about an improbable risk and one for which she would not advise therapeutic abortion."



Wendy McElroy, editor of the online magazine *ifeminists.com* asks in a web-posted article of March 25 2002, "If wrongful birth cases proliferate, will doctors advise abortions even when risks are not probable?"

EUTHANASIA SEVERELY UNDERREPORTED

AMSTERDAM, February 28, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) Doctors in Holland, where euthanasia is permitted, are illegally euthanizing patients since they feel the required reporting procedure is bothersome, according to an investigative television program which aired in Holland last night. The television program "Reporter" said that thousands of cases of life-shortening acts are not being reported to the regional committees, which are to judge whether the euthanasia in the particular case is allowable under Dutch law.

According to official statistics, the number of reported euthanasia cases reduced by 8 percent last year. However, according to doctors, the official figures do not present a reliable picture. An anonymous survey of 355 lung specialists, cited by the program, found that many doctors resent the official euthanasia protocols and duty to report. They find them too time-consuming.

In order to evade the procedure, doctors, under the pretext of pain management, give severely ill persons a lethal dose of morphine. Patients are also rendered unconscious with a sedative and then receive no food or fluids.

DYING WITH DIGNITY'S REAL GOALS

TORONTO, March 20 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - Canada's Euthanasia Prevention Coalition (EPC) issued a release yesterday with evidence that Dying with Dignity does in fact strongly advocate illegal assisted suicide measures for vulnerable individuals.

Controversy has been growing following the discovery by (EPC), of a \$177,800 grant by the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF), to Dying with Dignity (DWD).

The EPC release states DWD, Canada's largest organization promoting Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide, received a three-year grant for the purpose of

establishing a counselling program for terminally ill people. On February 5, 2003 EPC called for an independent inquiry by the Ontario Ministry of Culture into the Ontario Trillium Foundation's approval of a grant for \$177,800 over three years to Dying with Dignity (DWD) for its 'pilot counselling program in Toronto providing information, support and assistance to terminally ill individuals. "At the time we had no information concerning the proposed counselling program, we simply were suspicious of their intentions considering the purpose of their organization."

"EPC has done extensive background research, and has uncovered information that seems to indicate that, despite DWD's strong denials, that their initial suspicions are well founded."

BILL TO BAN EUTHANASIA BY STARVATION AND DEHYDRATION

LONDON, March 14, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) has reported that the upper house of the UK's parliament has approved the first stage of a bill to ban euthanasia by starvation and dehydration. The Patients' Protection Bill, tabled by veteran pro-life campaigner Baroness Knight of Collingtree, was given a second reading in the House of Lords Wednesday and sent without a vote to a committee for further consideration.

The bill has received support from across the political spectrum, says SPUC. Lord Howe, the Conservative health spokesman, said: "[T]he volume of letters and e-mails that I have received on the subject testifies to the widespread concern that exists among the public about the treatment of terminally ill and frail elderly people in our hospitals." Lord Carlile, a medical lawyer and Liberal Democrat peer, said: "What cannot be acceptable is the deliberate withdrawal of the very basis of human life - food and water, nutrition and hydration."

2003 BC PRO-LIFE CONFERENCE

The Pro-Life Society of B.C. held its annual provincial conference March 28 and 29 at the Days Inn, Surrey, BC.

Gwen Landolt, a graduate from the Faculty of Law at the University of British Columbia and National Vice-President of REAL Women of Canada gave Friday evening's opening address, "Defaulting on Respect for

Human Life and the Traditional Family: Who Influences the Lawmakers."

Well-known broadcaster, columnist and journalist, Michael Coren, was the keynote speaker for Saturday's banquet. Other scheduled speakers included:

Dr. Will Johnston, a Vancouver family physician and president of Physicians for Life Canada and co-chair of the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition/BC. He spoke on the topic, "Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide: Winning the Battle Through Love, Compassion, Caring and Education."

Kristi Panchuk, a recent graduate in nursing from Trinity Western University who spoke on the topic, "Hope for this Generation: A Pro-Life Philosophy that Reaches a Hopeless Culture," and later in the day, "The Answer to IVF: Fertility Treatment that Respects the Dignity of the Person". Kristi is active in the North American Youth Alliance, a worldwide pro-life youth group with more than a million members.

Pavel Reid, the director of Life and Family for the Archdiocese of Vancouver, spoke on "New Threats to Human Life." As we all know, the new reproductive technologies are opening up a whole new avenue for the destruction of human life.

The other two timely speakers were Vincent Van Belen, a student at the University College of the Fraser Valley and member of their Advocates for Life Club, and Elizabeth Ring-Cassidy, from the prestigious deVeber Institute based in Toronto that carries on a program of research and publication on contemporary bio-ethical and social issues. Van Belen's topic was "Challenging the Youth: Bringing the Truth to the Academia" and Ring-Cassidy's was "Exploring Post-Abortion Complications: The Medical and Psychological Evidence."

Participating in a Pro-Life Conference is a great educational and inspirational experience. Hopefully next year we will have a large contingent of attendees and not just our president!

QUEBEC OFFERS CHILD-BIRTH INCENTIVES

QUEBEC CITY, March 17, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - Quebec, the Canadian province with the highest rate of abortion and one of the lowest birthrates, is attempting to divert the looming ageing and worker shortage crises with incentives for childbirth. The ruling PQ Party has

offered to pay half the loans of graduating students if they have children within the first five years after graduation.

The PQ has already promised to enact a four-day work week for parents with young children. Historically they have offered baby bonuses of \$500 for the first child, \$1,000 for the second and \$7,500 for the third and for each subsequent child, which did much to bolster the birthrate.

Party Leader Bernard Landry responded to the charge that he was pushing women to have children by saying, ""I never knew women could make babies without men. The only known case of parthenogenesis - of immaculate conception - is the Virgin Mary. It takes two for the rest."

ADULT STEM CELLS AND DIABETES

LONDON, March 17, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - Diabetes is the latest in a growing list of diseases that may be on the threshold of being treated with cures derived from adult stem cells, according to a new study. The other diseases include brain damage, multiple sclerosis and sickle cell anaemia.

Researchers at the New York University School of Medicine suggest that adult bone marrow may be converted into insulin-producing beta cells in the pancreas to replace those damaged when someone has diabetes. So far, they have found that the cells developed properties associated with the crucial beta cells in mice.

Mehboob Hussain, assistant professor of medicine and pharmacology, says, "I am absolutely excited by the potential applications of our findings. In our body,

there is an additional, easily accessible source of cells that are capable of becoming insulin-producing pancreatic endocrine cells. Transplantation of bone marrow stem cells already is a routine procedure for treating cancer and other diseases, and we could build on that experience."

MEMBERS VOTE ON AMENDMENTS TO STEM CELL BILL

OTTAWA, March 27, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - Members of the House of Commons voted yesterday on several key amendments aimed at improving the Assisted Human Reproduction Act Bill C-13. MPs voted by a narrow majority to support Motion 13 by Liberal MP Paul Szabo, which banned human cloning by "any technique".

Reliable sources report that Liberal Health Minister Anne McLellan was heard yesterday suggesting that Paul Szabo's successful Motion 13, which amended the bill to ban cloning by 'any technique', will be reversed in the Senate.

However, Canadian Alliance MP Jason Kenney's Motion 17 to ban destructive research on human embryos was defeated as was a motion by Alliance MP Maurice Vellacott, which aimed to limit in vitro fertilization treatments to heterosexual couples.

SCIENTIST WARNS OF GENETIC DISCRIMINATION

LONDON, March 6, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - Sir Paul Nurse, a Nobel Prize-winning British scientist, warned fellow scientists this week that advances in genetic research herald "genetic discrimination" within 20 years. By that time, he predicts, the entire genetic code of every newborn baby could be recorded and used for or against the person for the rest of his life. "We need to be extremely careful how this technology is used to shape our society," he said.

Individual genome sequences, which reveal each individual's susceptibility to particular diseases, could be recorded on every citizen's health or identity cards, Nurse told a gathering of the Royal Society, an academy of scientists. In turn, the information would

allow health care providers, insurance companies, employers and every branch of government to treat people differently. At the very least, it could mean higher fees and insurance premiums for people with genetic defects, reports said.

Nurse won the 2001 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine jointly with Leland H. Hartwell, R. and Timothy Hunt for their discoveries of "key regulators of the cell cycle."

58-YEAR-OLD IVF MOTHER

LONDON, February 18, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - A 58-year-old woman has become Britain's oldest mother of twins after undergoing IVF intervention. Janet Boshier, a retired nurse, gave birth to twins named Sarah and James last September using donated embryos.

Dr. Ian Craft, whose London clinic created Europe's first IVF twins in 1982, oversaw the treatment. He last made headlines in 1997 when 60-year-old Welsh farmer's wife Liz Buttle became Britain's oldest-ever IVF mother.

Ms. Boshier's twins currently lack a father figure after Martin Maslin, the man identified as her "partner," died two weeks ago of a heart attack. If Ms. Boshier lives to age 76, she may see her twins complete high school.

BAN DESTRUCTIVE RESEARCH ON EMBRYOS

OTTAWA, March 19, 2003 (*LifeSiteNews.com*) - During debate on the group 2 amendments, Canadian Alliance MP Jason Kenney rose to argue for his Motion 17 which he said "would have the effect of prohibiting destructive research on human embryos."

Kenney pointed out that "If the bill were to pass unamended, the signal would go out to companies and laboratories that it is now open season on embryos and for the first time taxpayers' dollars would go toward funding this destructive research." He explained, "What embryonic stem cell research means, even on spare embryos, is that we take an embryo that has been created as part of an attempt by a couple to conceive a child and decide that this embryo, this tiny male or female human being with a unique genetic identity of its own, is not worthy of life or even of a decent, dignified death, but that it is merely raw material for genetic research, for commodification."

He continued: "We take other embryos, the brothers or sisters of the one we are researching on, and implant them into the womb of a mother with the hope that they will become children. However, the embryo that is left over we do not treat as human, but as a mere object worthy of nothing but disposal." Kenney reminded his colleagues, "Every single one of the 301 members of the House was once an embryo, no bigger than the head of a pin."

EMBRYONIC STEM CELL RESEARCH PASSES

In spite of the best efforts of MPs, both Canadian Alliance and back bench Liberals, Jason Kenny's amendment to Bill C-13 on assisted reproduction went down to defeat on Wednesday, March 26, Canadian parliamentarians voted down Motion 17 which would have prevented embryonic human beings being both created and used solely for research purposes. By time you get this newsletter chances are that Bill C-13 will have been passed in the House of Commons. It is expected to go to the Senate in early April.

The only recourse left is for an amendment to be passed in the Senate to disallow this commodification of human life. Hopefully, the senators, most of who have come out of an earlier time when beginning human life was looked on as inviolable, will be more sympathetic. It is well known, however, that the appointed Senate does not tend to go against the elected House unless they get the sense there is a great swell of support from the general populace. This can happen if, and only if, the citizens in this democratic country get politically active.

The fact that another amendment, Motion 13, to ban all forms of cloning, passed in the House on the same day that Motion 17 was defeated, gives one hope that the killing of human embryos to get at their stem cells can also be stopped.
